# International Experience

Between 1968 and 1992, I made ten trips to Western and Eastern Europe, Russia (then USSR), and a trip around the world. I have studied Russian in St. Petersburg (then Leningrad), attended summer language institutes in Bulgaria and Macedonia, worked as a translator in Macedonia, taught English in Iaşi, Romania as a Fulbright lecturer, served as a United States Information Agency exhibit guide in Romania, and developed natural language computer interface applications in Croatia.

In 2001, I traveled to Japan with my daughter for the centennial celebration of the Seattle Buddhist Temple. In summer, 2003, I led a group of ten high school students from Garfield Technology Academy in Seattle to St. Petersburg, Russia, to install computer networks in two orphanages. Later that summer, our family traveled to Japan for several weeks. In March, 2008, I traveled with my family to Germany, France, and St. Petersburg, Russia, where our son was teaching English. In February, 2009, Germany invited me to participate in an international delegation to study the German education system. In 2011, I traveled to Germany again and made two trips to China: one in March to interview guest teacher applicants for the College Board and one in December to attend the annual conference of Confucius Institutes sponsored by Hanban in Beijing. In September 2013, I traveled to Chongqing, China as a representative of the Confucius Institute of the State of Washington. In June 2014, I was invited to participate in the Japan Foundation sponsored Invitational Tour of Japan for Educators.
