20 year commitment to digital equity


- The Technology Matching Fund (TMF) celebrates 20 years of supporting digital equity in Seattle
- \$4.2 million awarded to 302 projects since 1997
- 2017: \$430,000 funding will support 15 new projects:
 - \$320,000 cable franchise fees
 - \$85,000 public benefits via cable franchise agreement with Comcast
 - \$25,000 gift from Facebook

Grant application process

- 36 applications requesting over \$1.1 million
- Community Technology Advisory Board Review
- Selection Criteria
 - Meets program goals
 - Community partnerships
 - Budget
 - Community benefit
 - Project clarity
 - Project evaluation

Recommendations

- Projects will reach over 6,000 residents throughout the City.
- Grants will benefit over 3,665 immigrants and refugees, 1,580 seniors and 1,120 people with disabilities.
- Two projects will provide technology training for youth through STEM and digital media opportunities.
- Four projects will serve the East African Community responding to many needs identified in the Office of Immigrant Rights recent report "Voices of Seattle's East African Communities".
- Three projects will focus on seniors, supporting the Mayor's Age-friendly Initiative.
