The Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative (SYVPI) was launched in 2009 as a partnership between the City of Seattle and several community-based organizations designed to reduce youth violence in Seattle. Myself in partnership with other community organizers, educators and Entrepreneurs created the S.T.A.R.T.S. (Students Taking Agriculture 'Round The Streets). S.T.A.R.T.S. was a multi pronged food justice program focused on Media, entrepreneurship, kitchen skills, food literacy. I helped to design curriculum and coordinate the program. Created a network of community partnerships to support our curriculum. Taught youth kitchen safety and kitchen skills, Ran Icebreakers and community building exercises to ensure trust and respect in our group. Lead the youth in critical thinking exercises. Researched literature and documentaries used to provided analysis of the themes of our curriculum engaged Youth in their community with local urban farms/green spaces, other local entrepreneurs and neighborhood walks to examine themes of food literacy in their community.

Open Arms Perinatal Services, Seattle, WA — Volunteer *Outreach Birth Doula*

November 2006-2008

I served women of color often of low economic backgrounds from the third trimester through birth and until a baby is about six to eight weeks old. My services included prenatal support and parenting education, continuous emotional and physical support throughout labor and delivery, hospital patient advocacy and assistance in early postpartum. I was responsible for maintaining confidential case notes to track program outcomes.
