- Entering second year of a biennium; potential issues include supplemental budget, mental health funding, property taxes
- November Assembly Days 13th 17th
- Democrats took over State Senate, hold a 25 24 majority

Key Agenda Issues for 2018: <u>Homelessness, Housing, and</u> <u>the Safety Net</u>

- Additional funding to address the homelessness crisis: Document Recording Fee
- Additional affordable housing tools: Location options, Housing Trust Fund, enhanced tenants rights, Source of Income Discrimination, repeal or modify RCW 35.21.830
- Enhanced funding for mental health, behavioral health, public health, and human services

Key Agenda Issues for 2018: Law & Public Safety

- Ability to hire non-citizens for public safety employment
- Gun safety
- Ban the Box
- Voting Rights Act
- Use of deadly force
- Repeal the death penalty

Key Agenda Issues for 2018: Environment
