

Resume: Chris Wiley

Chris Wiley is the City of Seattle's fleet director, a position he has held since October 2012. As the City's fleet director, he:

- Provides executive leadership to the service programs and staff that manage the City of Seattle's 4,100 vehicles and pieces of equipment.
- Develops and manages a \$53M annual budget, which includes \$20M for operations and maintenance, \$18M for capital equipment purchases, and \$15M for fuel and parts inventory purchases.
- Develops the rate-setting methodology and oversees biennial establishment of rates for: internal lease, parts markup, fuel markup, motor pool use, and billable labor.
- Ensures continuity of operations at six (6) physical maintenance locations, 33 fueling stations, and a centralized motor pool with 68 vehicles.
- Ensures a staff of 129 technical and administrative professionals are well-trained, provide excellent customer service to internal and external customers, and are safely conducting their work.
- Establishes citywide fleet use policies.
- Understands and directs the use of a computerized fleet information management system and its integration into the cost and billing structure of the City's financial system.

Prior to his promotion to the City of Seattle's fleet director, Chris was the City's Green Fleet Coordinator. Chris had several key functions in this position – helping City departments develop and implement fuel reduction strategies; developing education and outreach to facilitate behavior change; identifying and recommending use of alternative fuels and advanced technology vehicles; and developing innovative policy to reduce fuel use and greenhouse gas emissions.

Prior to coming to the City of Seattle, Chris was the executive director of the Pacific Northwest Pollution Prevention Resource Center (PPRC), a Northwest region non-profit organization. As the executive director, he was responsible for management of all operations at PPRC. This included: project development and management, fund-raising, grant writing, grant and contract negotiations, market development, organization strategy, board liaison, forming strategic partnerships and management of six staff members. Chris gained valuable experience in working on federally funded initiatives because 95% of the organization's revenue came from competitive federal grant funds. Before Chris became the executive director of PPRC, he worked for the same organization as the industry outreach manager. Chris worked for this organization for 13 years.

Chris started his career in 1991 as an environmental and safety compliance manager for Capital Industries Inc., a large metal fabricator in Seattle, WA.

Chris holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Assessment and Policy from Western Washington University.
