# **Community Engagement Plan for CB 119202**

The Seattle Office for Civil Rights (SOCR) strives to advance community-driven solutions to bring about greater equity for all Seattle residents and community members. Our policy development process generally involves extensive community engagement to determine the best solutions to a stated problem and identify any unintended consequences of proposed policies or programs.

To that end, SOCR would like to conduct a stakeholder engagement process on proposed legislation, CB Council Bill 119202, which will extend the statute of limitations for filing a claim under the City's anti-discrimination ordinances, amend the definition of discrimination, and add a discreet definition for the term sexual harassment.

SOCR supports creating greater ease of access to the City's anti-discrimination laws. At the same time, we would like to ensure stakeholders have a chance to review the legislation, provide comment, and identify any potential issues or gaps, before moving forward with the legislation.
