WHEREAS, industry participants have requested the City Council enact legislation to establish a minimum fare for all segments of the industry that ensures equal market access and establishes an industry aligned with the City's values of fairness, shared prosperity and transparency; NOW, THEREFORE,

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council requests that taxicab companies, for-hire companies, and transportation network companies (TNCs) provide the Director of Finance and Administrative Services the following data for each driver associated with each company at any time in calendar year 2017: the total number of hours the driver worked, or in the case of TNCs, were active on the companies' platform, the total duration of trips the drivers completed, the total value of the fares charged, and the total compensation to each driver for calendar year 2017. If the requested information is not provided to the Director by May 31, 2018, the Council will consider legislation requiring the data on fares charged, hours worked, total number of drivers, and driver compensation from all market participants, including possibly drivers, to support the formation of City Council policy for the industry. In drafting such legislation, the City Council will consider defining what constitutes an operating hour and will explore creative ways to address the concerns of market participants about the release of data.

Section 2. The City Council will consider legislation to establish a set of minimum charges across all segments of the for-hire transportation industry to ensure fair market access to all participants. Options could include setting a minimum base fare rate of \$2.40.
