I work with local governments and non-profit organizations across WA State on diverse public policy issues that help communities achieve their best futures. Areas of focus include land use planning, strategic planning, economic development and feasibility, and public policy analysis.

Outreach and Engagement Projects

- City of Kenmore, Imagine Kenmore (2015-2016): Led and designed outreach strategy for City of Kenmore to collect public feedback on proposed City improvement projects. Work included engagement with the general public by creating a website, online survey, online mapping comments, and open house meetings. Outreach results were analyzed and communicated to City Council to create a proposed project package. Voters passed a bond measure for "Walkways and Waterways" in November 2016 to approve a mix of sidewalk, bike, and waterfront improvements.
- City of Chelan Comprehensive Plan Update (2016-2017): Engaged various stakeholders including residents, local property owners, and developers in sharing their ideas on the vision of Chelan and also on land use change proposals. Created outreach posters and flyers, designed online surveys, public workshops, and community events to reach youth in schools.

Designed and implemented community outreach strategy, stakeholder interviews, and large focus groups. Employed a variety of outreach tools to engage a diverse population and facilitated large group discussions. Designed communication materials and strategic plan document design.

- Conducted interviews with local residents and property owners in Chinatown ID and Pioneer Square neighborhoods to document historic uses of alleys through oral histories. Designed and produced informational brochure to market alley storefronts for potential business development.
- Developed a report that analyzed effects of citywide parking policies on the neighborhood. Interviewed local stakeholders, reviewed current and past parking policies and studies and identified recommendations to increase social equity in parking management. The report informed future conversations on parking management in the neighborhood.
- Organized and facilitated a workshop to inform property owners of historic buildings on available resources for historic preservation.

The purposes of my thesis was to understand different land use planning models for rural village redevelopment and propose a set of landscape typology indicators and measures to develop a baseline of the existing typology to compare alternatives. This analysis would inform local planning policies and provide recommendations that best support the resilience of this historically productive agricultural landscape.
