Background

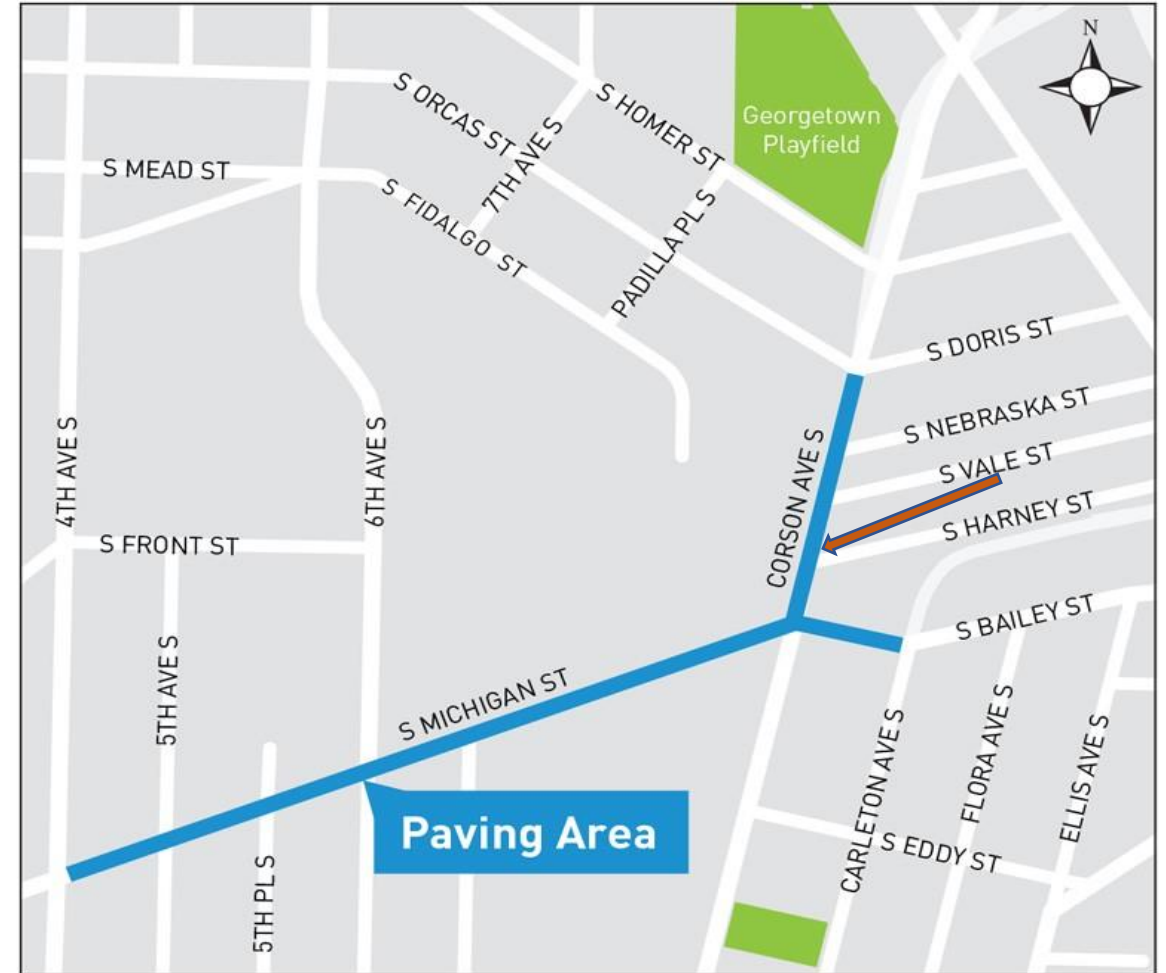
- The Arterial Asphalt and Concrete Program (AAC) invests in and maintains Seattle's arterial streets

2017 AAC Project Requiring Permanent Acquisition

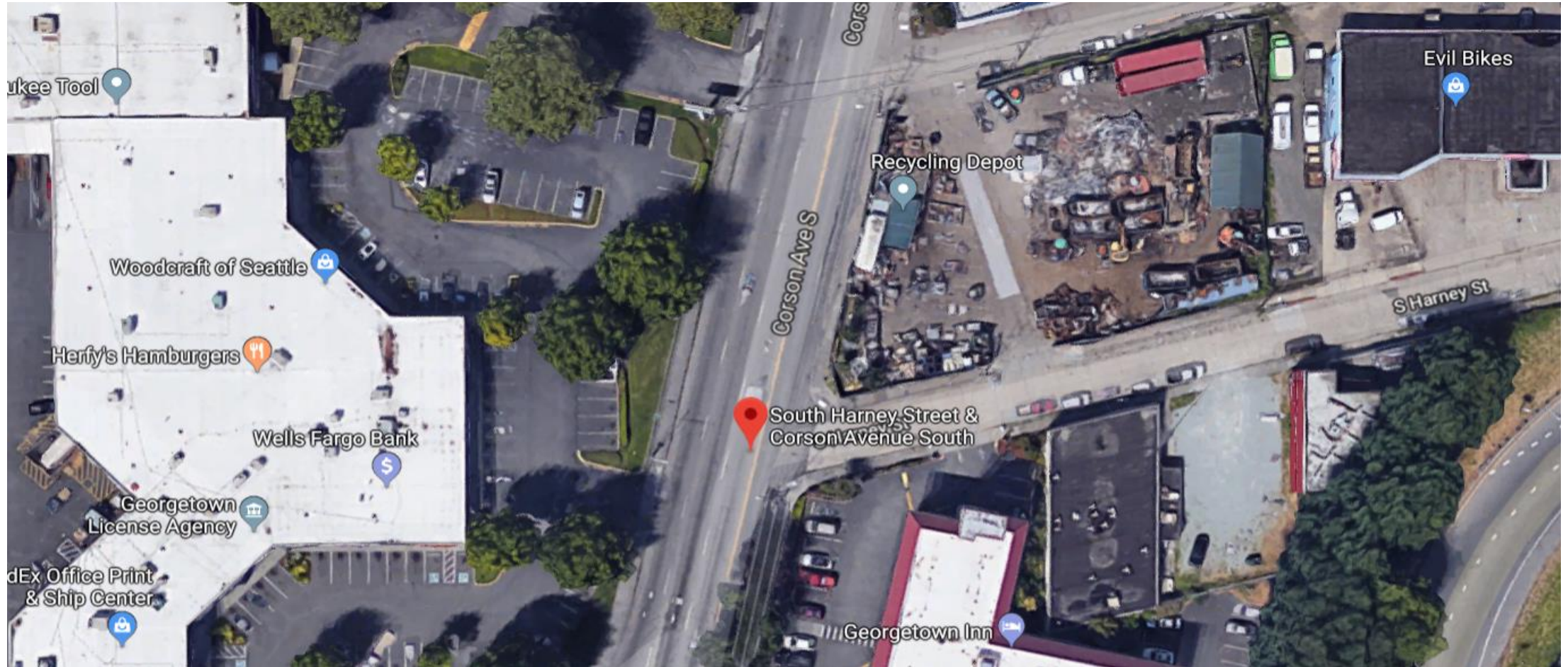

Georgetown Arterial Paving Project

- 1 property acquisition
- Totaling 11 square feet
- Curb ramp upgrade
