Seattle will be hosting the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle July 1 through July 6, 2018, with the support of community leaders and corporate partners. Approximately 3,000 athletes will be competing in activities and sports at venues around the City. Expressing commitment to being a city of diversity and inclusion, and being honored to be a part of a celebration to break down barriers and promote inclusion, the City via this resolution declares its intent to sponsor the games for \$30,000 and asks for the Executive departments to report back on how much they end up charging in fees and wages throughout the Games.
