COUNCIL BILL 119271

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2018, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, Seattle Department of Transportation, Seattle Fire Department, Seattle Police Department, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants, private funding, and subsidized loans and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or the Mayor's designee, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Fire Chief, the Chief of Police, and the Seattle Public Utilities General Manager and Chief Executive Officer are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below; and to execute, deliver, and perform, on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving funds identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as Council Bill 119272.

The bridge will accommodate a protected bike lane, pedestrian walkways, and three vehicle travel lanes. The PWTF Loan program is a low-cost lending option.
