1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation; amending Ordinance 125493, which amended the 2018 Budget (Ordinance 125475), including the 2018-2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP); reallocating funding from the Acquisition Category to the Opportunity Fund Category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; and revising project allocations in the 2018-2023 CIP; all by a 3/4 vote of the City Council.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation reallocates \$500,000 in the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy (2008 Parks Levy) from the Acquisition Category to the Opportunity Fund Category; increases appropriations to the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) in the 2018 Adopted Budget; and amends the 2018-2023 Adopted Capital Improvement Program by appropriating \$1,000,000 in the Opportunity Fund Category (K720041) for this project.

First Hill Hub Urban Village was identified as a priority neighborhood for park acquisition in both the 2000 Pro Parks Levy and the 2008 Parks Levy. Because of scarce opportunities and high land costs, DPR has not been able to acquire a property in the First Hill neighborhood for a new neighborhood park. Due to very high property values, we do not anticipate this changing in the foreseeable future. Fortunately, other public open space is being developed in the First Hill neighborhood through other projects, including, for example, approximately 10,000 square feet of new open space included in the new private development at 8th and Columbia.

In 2005, DPR developed a First Hill Park Plan that projected significant population growth in First Hill and recommended several strategies to satisfy park needs in the First Hill Urban Village, including upgrading First Hill Park. Having secured matching fund grants from Department of Neighborhoods, the First Hill community has embarked on upgrading First Hill Park. The community has done extensive public outreach and hired a landscape architect to develop designs for the park. The community has secured \$500,000 from Swedish Medical Center as public benefit for an alley vacation on their campus. However, there is still a shortfall of \$500,000 to complete the project as designed. The proposed shift in funding priorities will close this funding gap and all the project to be completed as designed.

The proposed project is consistent with the 2005 First Hill Urban Center Park Plan, which recommended upgrading First Hill Park. The development project has the support of the First Hill Improvement Association (FHIA).
