### BRIFF BIO

Catherine Hillenbrand is a 40 year resident of Capitol Hill. She has had several businesses on the Hill including the Comet Tavern and the Real Comet Press. After 30 plus years in the Stevens neighborhood, she and her husband are resident owners of the DuBois Apartments near Seattle Central Community College. Their two sons attended Puget Sound Primary School, Stevens Elementary, Seattle Academy and Running Start at SCCC. Cathy currently chairs the Steering Committee of the Capitol Hill Champlon, a joint venture of the Community Council and the Chamber, formed to advocate for implementation of our community's vision for the redevelopment of the light rail construction sites on Broadway.
