

I am submitting my application to be a board member of the Seattle Schools Traffic Safety Committee because of my abiding interest and avocation in helping Seattle achieve safer and more pleasant streets. In particular, Safer Routes to School has become a special interest.

Since retiring in 2011 from a 37 year career in architecture, city planning, and major institutional facility management I have become very involved in a number of community organizations working on improving the city and its neighborhoods. I have become very active in Seattle Neighborhood Greenways, Licton Springs Community Council, the Aurora Licton Urban Village Alliance, and others.

Since high school I had always been active outdoors walking, hiking, and bicycling. My interest in those activities evolved into an interest in city planning and all-mode transportation. The interest naturally pervaded my professional career and my work with community groups.

4 years ago, in 2014, I became involved with community concerns related to the former Wilson Pacific campus, now the Robert Eagle Staff and Cascadia campus. The obvious critical transportation and safety issues quickly focused my attention on Safe Routes to School.

I helped lead an effort involving Seattle Neighborhood Greenways and many local community groups to advocate for improvements and to work collaboratively with SDOT and the Department of Neighborhoods to identify needs and solutions and to find and obtain funding sources. We succeeded in achieving many of the improvements for which we advocated.

One of the foundational keys to our success was our collaborative approach to address difficult problems.
