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permit applications for projects with certain uses that are not consistent with neighborhood plan goals and policies. If this were to occur, proliferation of these uses could preclude development that is more consistent with the neighborhood plan goals and policies, which is contrary to the public interest as described in the findings of fact contained in Ordinance 125425.

E. Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.390 authorizes the City to extend the duration of a moratorium by ordinance for one or more six-month periods.

Section 2. The moratorium set forth in Ordinance 125425 shall be extended and in effect
