1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Neighborhood Matching Fund Program; establishing new program guidelines and an automatic carry-forward policy
- 2. Summary and background of the Legislation: This legislation would establish updated program guidelines and an automatic carry forward feature for the Neighborhood Matching Fund (NMF) program. The revised program guidelines, which are appended to the legislation as Attachment A, articulate NMF application, project review, and award practices consistent with the program's current funding requirements and organizational model. Establishing an automatic carry forward policy would allow unexpended appropriations for NMF-funded community projects (excluding project development and management costs) to remain available through the subsequent calendar year until fully expended, abandoned or reappropriated. As the implementation timelines for NMF-funded projects do not always align with a calendar year, establishing an automatic carry forward feature would provide additional funding surety to community groups receiving NMF support for their activities.
