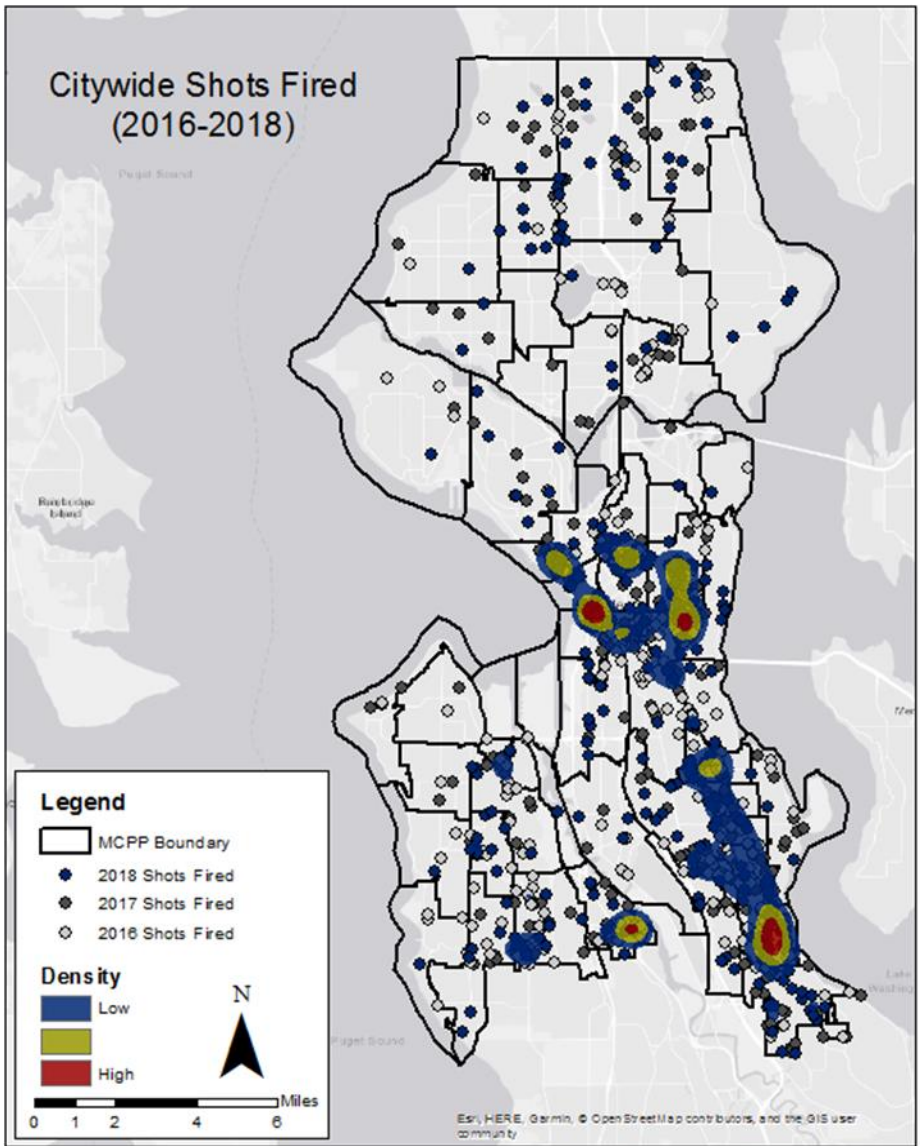

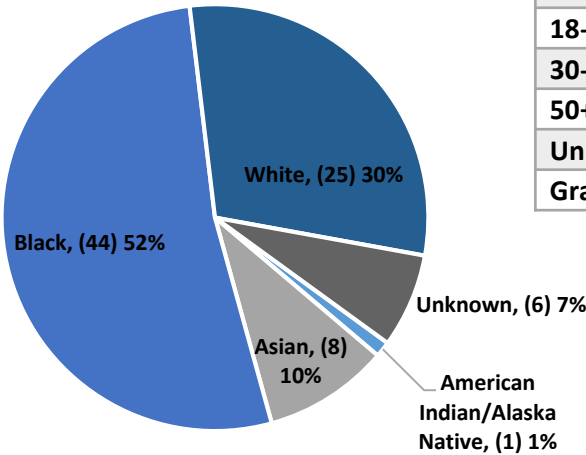


# Shooting Victim and Suspect Demographics

Of the 79 incidents with injuries, demographics for 84 victims and 103 suspects were found at the time of the incident.

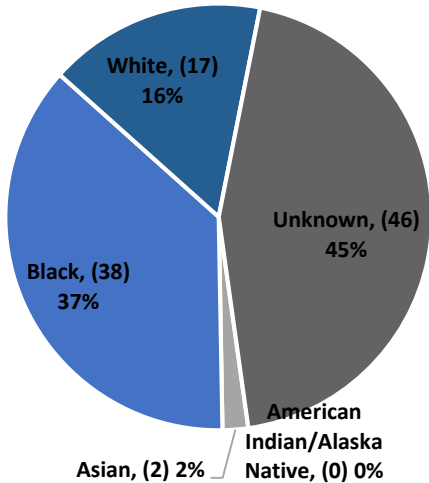

# 2019 Year-to-Date Shots Fired



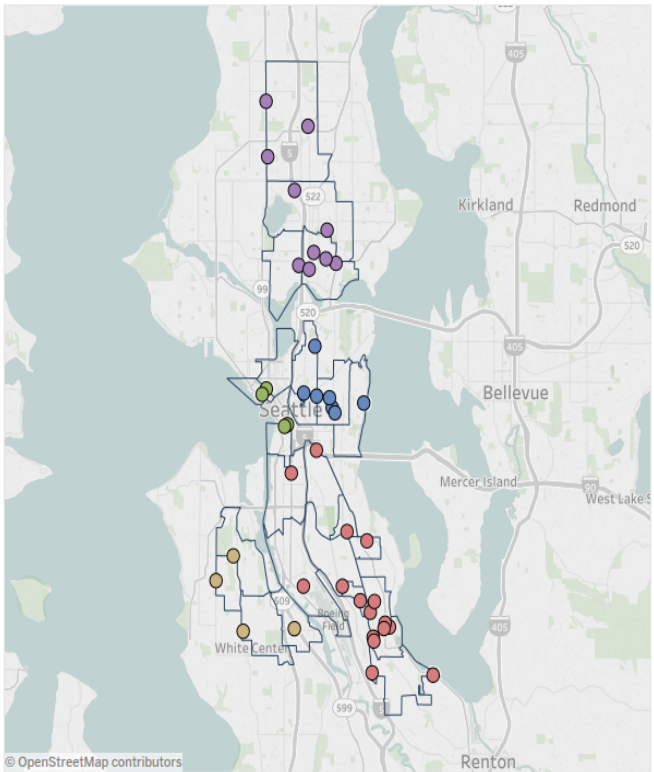
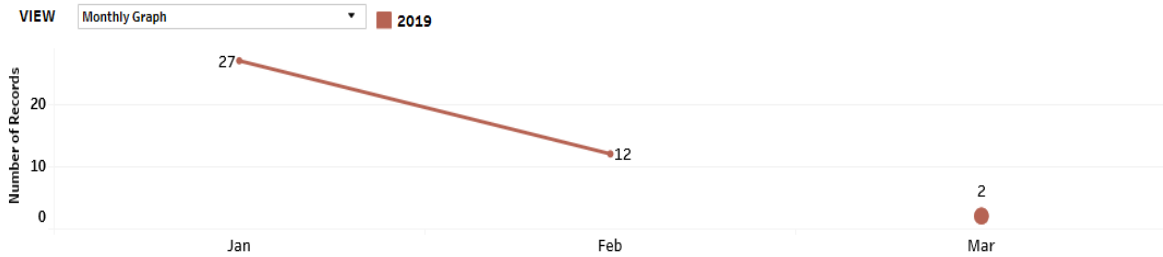
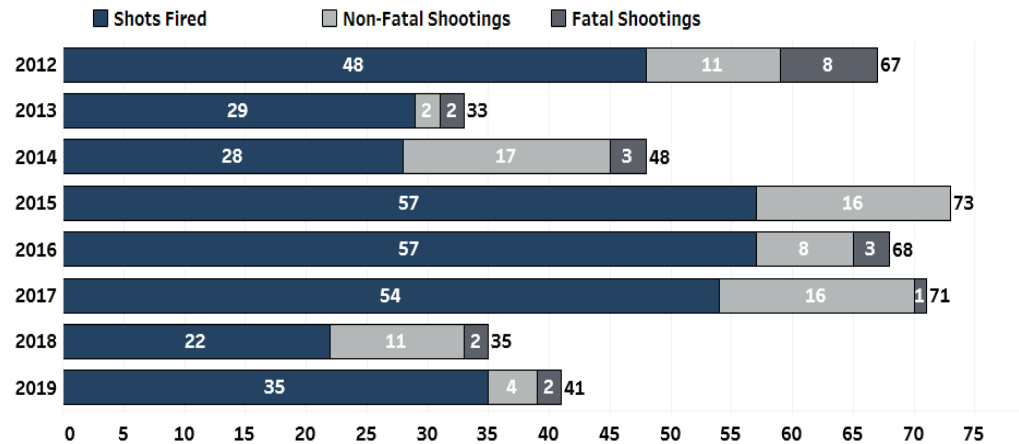

# Current and Proposed Responses

## Current Operations

- Community Engagement
  - Alive & Free
  - Project Safe Neighborhoods
  - Engaging with United Black Christian Clergy, Seattle LINC, and other community leaders to discuss community-based interventions
  - Our Best – a robust mentoring campaign to address unique social and economic challenges facing young black men
  - Youth Opportunities Initiative
- Regional Gun Crime Task Force (National Crime Gun Intelligence Centers Initiative)
  - SPD recovered 1,408 firearms in 2018 (10% increase over 2017)
  - 237 new NIBIN hits in 2018; 123 linked to SPD cases
  - 52% of 2018 Shots Fired incidents linked to a NIBIN hit
- Red Flag/ERPO/DVPO Teams
  - ERPO – 80 incidents/individuals assessed, 32 ERPOs petitioned, 29 full ERPOs granted, 79 firearms seized from 27 individuals.
  - DVPO – Recovered 137 firearms in 2018, primarily as a result of voluntary compliance with DVPO court orders

# Current and Proposed Responses

- On-going collaboration with King County Prosecutor's Office to track regional shots fired cases
- On-going participation with Harborview Injury Prevention & Research Center
- Rule-making and evaluation partner on Safe Storage law
- Working with Washington DOC to provide extra outreach to high-risk offenders in the area
- SPD consistently has a homicide clearance rate (9 year average of 68%) above the national average of 60%

## Potential Responses and Research

- Active participant in multiple research submissions to the National Collaborative on Gun Violence Research (Arnold Ventures and RAND)
- Helping Individuals with Firearm Injuries (Harborview) Research Committee
- Working with Washington Alliance for Gun Responsibility and an independent researcher to examine the trends across years of NIBIN trace data
