AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation; authorizing the acceptance of a gift of a timber pavilion structure from the Seattle Parks Foundation to be installed in Occidental Square Park for public use.

WHEREAS, the Seattle Parks Foundation, a non-profit organization created in 1999 to provide funds, project support, and advocacy to improve and expand Seattle's parks and greenspaces, and the Alliance for Pioneer Square, created to lead the implementation of the most recent neighborhood plan, "Pioneer Square 2015," have offered to construct a timber pavilion in Occidental Square Park, located at 117 S Washington Street, beginning in 2019, and when construction is complete, to gift it to The City of Seattle ("City"); and WHEREAS, the pavilion will consist of an approximately 13- by 17-foot wood structure that uses and reflects the latest timber technologies and will replace the current kiosk building. The pavilion will function as an information and concierge station for park and Pioneer Square visitors. A large glass roof will sit gracefully above the structure and extend into the park, providing opportunities for play, performance, and classes in a beautiful covered space. The new pavilion will provide for enhanced park activation and

WHEREAS, the Seattle Parks Foundation is the fiscal sponsor and lead on the project, working in partnership with the Alliance for Pioneer Square; and

will replace a smaller existing kiosk building in need of repairs; and

WHEREAS, the pavilion will receive all necessary permits including a Certificate of Approval from the Pioneer Square Preservation Board; and

Section 2. Upon completion of construction to the Superintendent's satisfaction, the

Superintendent is authorized to accept a deed of gift of such pavilion on behalf of the City.

Four years ago, Seattle Parks Foundation commissioned Dan Biederman (of New York's Bryant Park) to assess current conditions at Occidental Square and to develop a plan to revitalize that park so that it could be a vibrant and welcoming gathering place for people of all ages and walks of life. His report guided an effort to dramatically enhance public life in Occidental Square and Westlake Park—an effort now led by Downtown Seattle Association, with major financial and fundraising support from Seattle Parks Foundation, Alliance for Pioneer Square, and Friends of Waterfront Seattle and in deep partnership with Seattle Parks and Recreation.

As you know, this work—generously supported by downtown businesses and pilot funding from the Metropolitan Park District—has been remarkably successful and now serves as proof of concept for the new model of public benefit partnership that will support programming and stewardship along the new central waterfront.

Seattle Parks Foundation is continuing to build on this success and has raised funds to construct a beautiful public pavilion in Occidental Square. Designed by internationally acclaimed architects at Olson Kundig, this pavilion is a 13-foot by 17-foot wood structure that nests nicely on an existing raised platform area at the north end of the park. It will serve as a visitor center, a stage for the numerous performances in the park, and a glass-roofed, lit porch for park users in inclement weather.

Private donations fully fund the design, permitting, and installation of the pavilion and all the necessary work to deliver a complete project to the City of Seattle. Seattle Parks Foundation will gift the pavilion to the City, and it will be the City's responsibility to maintain it.
