Carol is a Senior Planner with experience in extensive multimodal transportation planning, pedestrian safety programs, community relations, and project management. She is a certified Complete Streets Trainer. Her work with Toole Design includes various pedestrian and bicycle assessment for schools, mixed use neighborhoods, and as part of master planning. Carol's current work includes understanding the active transportation needs of seniors. She has also designed and led public engagement activities aimed at overcoming language and other barriers to participation. During her 11 years with the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA), Carol worked on numerous pedestrian and bicycle initiatives.

Wichita (KS) Senior Walking Routes and Neighborhood Circulation Plans, Wichita, KS Carol managed two projects with health department funding – one aimed at creating and applying design guidelines for older pedestrians; the other developed a toolkit to identify neighborhood circulation improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists. Both projects will help fulfill strategies in the City's Pedestrian Master Plan aimed at improving the well-being of seniors and mobility of all residents. The guidelines developed as part of the senior walking is project are grounded in the ways to design pedestrian infrastructure that address the needs of older pedestrians. For the neighborhood circulation project, Carol develop, then tested a process and toolkit for planning improvements for those walking and bicycling in neighborhoods.

#### Louisville Community Walkability Plan, Louisville, KY

As Project Manager, Carol reviewed several key policy documents for Louisville, recommending changes to strengthen the pedestrian network through concrete land-use transportation connections. Key issues for developing the Plan included promoting healthy lifestyles through the built environment, integrating the City's Safe Routes to Schools (SRTS) program, and accessible pedestrian facilities for seniors and persons with disabilities.

#### Wilmapco Route 9 Corridor Study, New Castle, DE

Carol served as Project Manager for Toole Design's work on the Route 9
Corridor Master Plan in New Castle. Recommendations for redevelopment and multimodal transportation were needed to maximize benefits from a new library and community center. Carol used traffic analysis and field observations to develop pedestrian and bicycle network recommendations focused on safety and connectivty and developed redesigns for four intersections.
