AMP Story-gathering



- 33 people shared stories, through video and audio interviews, along with written testimonies
- Interview subjects self-identified as
 - Black/African American
 - Native/indigenous
 - Asian/Pacific Islander
 - Latinx
 - Biracial, multiracial or as people of color
 - Some were adopted and unsure of ancestry



- They ranged in age from 24 to 69
- They represented a range of gender expressions, though folks who identify as trans didn't consent to interviews
- Some subjects are living with HIV; others had family members who died of complications from AIDS or have family members living with HIV; some work or worked for organizations that serve people living with AIDS
- Together, their stories account for 60+ hours of storytelling



- Most subjects came through relationships forged with seven partner organizations:
 - AARTH (African-American Reach and Teach Health ministry)
 - BABES Network
 - Bailey-Boushay House
 - Center for Multicultural Health
 - Entre Hermanos
 - Gay City
 - POCAAN (formerly People of Color Against AIDS Network)
