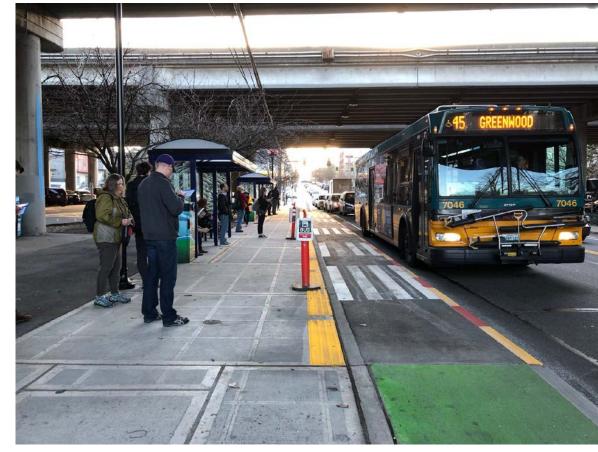

Q2 Performance Summary

- Q2 saw a continued ramp-up in delivery that is typical of the late spring and beginning of the construction season
- All programs are expected to meet planned accomplishments for 2019
- Five construction contracts were advertised in Q2 and five construction contracts were awarded

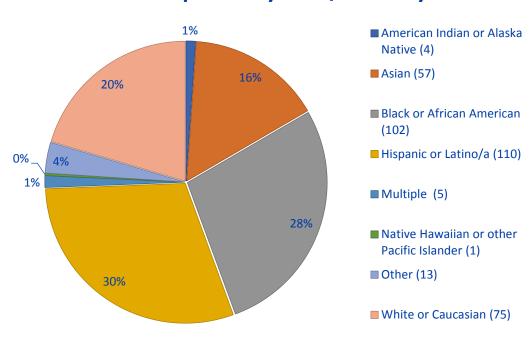
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Neighborhood Street Fund: Targeted outreach during vote phase

- Received over 6,750 votes online
- Additional 700 in-person votes collected at library ballot boxes or at targeted outreach events.
- Additional outreach in Districts 1, 2 and 5
- Paper ballots vs online ballots
 - Online voter breakdown 80% White, above age 50, live in D6
 - Paper ballots successful with non-English speakers and POC
- Total Events: 8
 - Pop-Up Events, Community Dinners, Voter Education Outreach Events, Open Houses
 - Ballots in 8 Languages
 - Number of Voters: 432

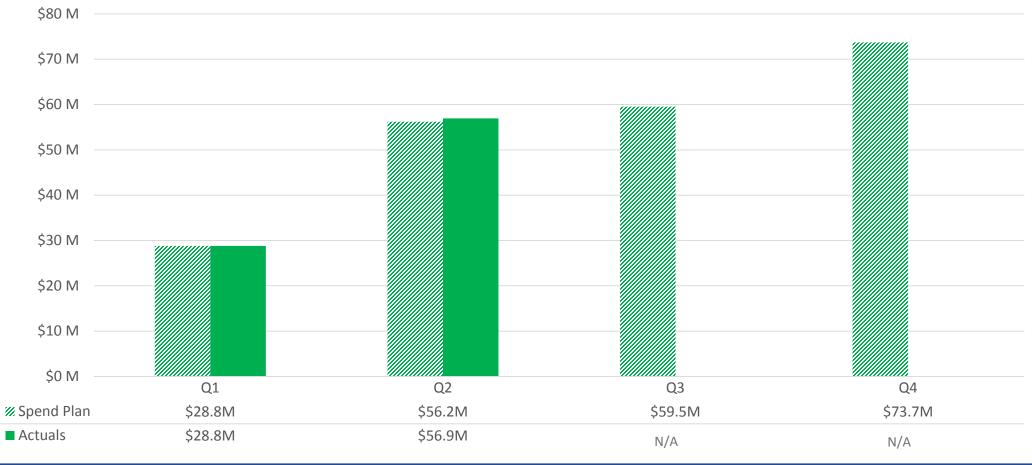

Participation By Race/Ethnicity

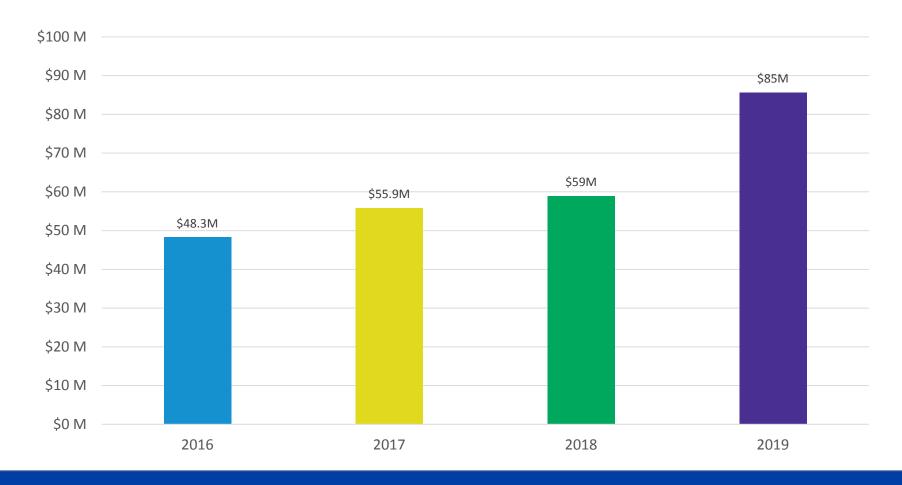




Q2 Finance Summary: \$56.2M spent in Q2, 100% of 2019 spend plan

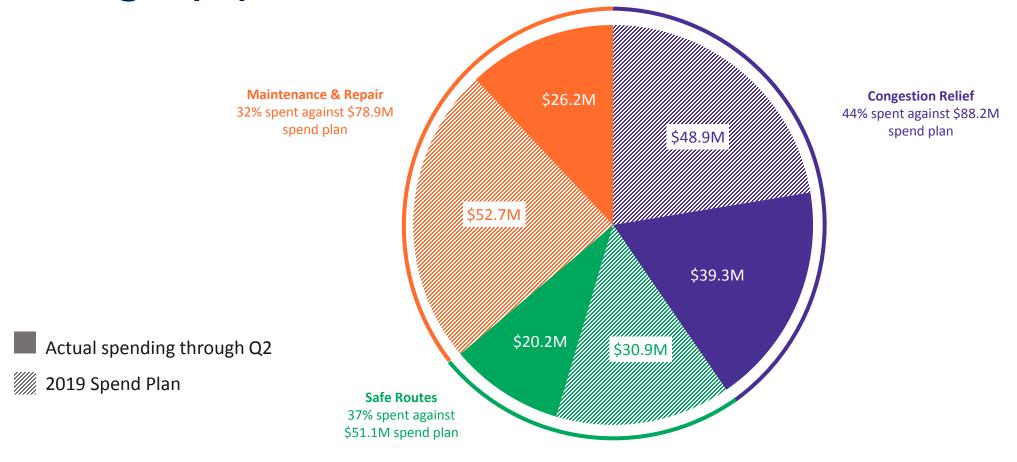


Q2 Finance Summary: \$85.7M spent to-date in 2019, 45% increase over 2018
