Professional Experience

Dorothy Holland Mann, a native of Annandale, Virginia, was the first woman and first African-American to head Region X of the US Public Health Service serving Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Alaska. She held that post from 1979 to 1993. During her tenure Region X led the nation in a number of public health initiatives including research on chlamydia diagnosis and treatment, improvement of national Pap Smear guidelines and establishing the first Office on Women's Health in a federal regional office. She also was the lead regional federal official for the Surgeon General's interpersonal violence prevention initiative.

Following her federal employment she headed Mayor Norman Rice's two-year Violence Prevention Project, publishing two documents, Building Blocks for Peace: Violence Prevention for You and Your community and Building Blocks for Peace: A Demonstration in Community Partnership at the conclusion of the Project in 1995.

At the University of Washington Institute for Public Policy and Management (1995-1996) — now the Evans School of Public Affairs — she led the first study for the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries on the incidence and prevalence of violence in the workplace. The study results were used by the Department to determine the need for State assistance to employers in the development of workplace violence prevention policies and procedures

Education

Dr. Mann received a PhD in 1993 from the Union Institute and University, Cincinnati, Ohio. a Master's Degree in Public Health (Health Management and Policy) in 1974 from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan and Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology in 1971 from Howard University, Washington DC. She served as Adjunct Clinical Associate Professor in the University School of Public Health from 1993 to 2016.

Community Service

Dr. Mann was a four term Chair of the Board of Group Health Cooperative (1987-1998); Member and Committee Chair, Board of the Kaiser Permanente Hospital and Health Plan, Oakland, CA (1997-2003); Member and Secretary, Board of Virginia Mason Medical Center (2006-2017).

Dr. Mann was a founding member of the Washington Women's Foundation. She is a past Chair of the Seattle Arts Commission; current member of the Seattle Art Museum Development Authority Counsel; and member of the Board and Chair Trustee and Governance Committee, Cornish College of the Arts (2012-2017). She currently serves on the Public Policy Council of the Children's Alliance; the Kaiser Permanente/Washington Consumer Advisory Committee and the Kaiser Permanente Research Bank National Consumer Advisory Committee/Oakland, CA.

At the end of 2009 Dr. Mann published her memoir, Guide My Feet. She has received numerous awards and recognitions over the course of her career and community service. Most recently, In 2012, she received the Distinguished Service Award for community service and volunteerism from the UW Health Science Center and Medical School in tribute to Martin Luther King Jr.

Dr. Mann's professional and personal travels have taken her to 40 countries in Europe; Sub-Sahara Africa; North Africa; Southeast Asia, Latin America, the Baltics and Russia
