BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:

Section 1. Victor Steinbrueck Park remains in need of improvements as envisioned in the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy. The design presented to the City Council for review meets the stated goals of: improving sight lines into the park; renovating seating; renovating the former children's play area; improving and expanding lighting; and upgrading the landscaping.

While the original children's play area is now the site of the Tree of Life art installation, installed after the levy was passed, the design has incorporated other elements to make the park welcoming and engaging to children and families as an alternative to renovating the former children's play area.

The design accomplishes the other stated goals of the levy by: providing upgraded lighting with modern fixtures to provide consistent light across the site to maximize visibility and safety and minimize the potential for spillover and glare to surrounding residents and businesses; improving seating for comfort and accessibility for all ages and abilities; improving sight lines to and through the park; and upgrading the landscaping to preserve the original design intent with durable, hardy, and native plant species.
