1 CITY OF SEATTLE 2 ORDINANCE _____ 3 COUNCIL BILL 4 ..title 5 AN ORDINANCE relating to emergency assistance for low-income City Light Department and 6 Seattle Public Utilities Department customers; amending Sections 21.49.042 and 7 21.76.065 of the Seattle Municipal Code to expand and align eligibility and assistance 8 guidelines for emergency assistance programs. 9 ..body 10 WHEREAS, in December 1985, the Emergency Low-Income Assistance program (ELIA) was 11 established by Ordinance 112637 to provide emergency, low-income assistance to certain 12 customers of the City Light Department (SCL); and 13 WHEREAS, the Emergency Assistance Program (EAP) was established by Ordinance 122174 in 14 2006 to provide emergency assistance to certain low-income customers of Seattle Public 15 Utilities (SPU); and 16 WHEREAS, there is a need to establish consistent eligibility and assistance guidelines across the 17 various City energy assistance programs; and 18 WHEREAS, Sections 21.49.042 and 21.76.065 of the Seattle Municipal Code provide for a 19 once-per-year emergency credit of 50 percent of an eligible customer's delinquent bills 20 up to a maximum credit amount; and 21 WHEREAS, when a minor child lives in an eligible customer's household, EAP allows the 22 customer to receive the emergency credit twice per calendar year; and 23 WHEREAS, ELIA is only available one time per 12-month period to families with children in 24 the household; and 25 WHEREAS, the assistance available through ELIA is a fixed \$200 per year and is not adjusted to 26 reflect average rate changes in residential bills; and

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1	WHEREAS, the assistance available through EAP is adjusted annually to reflect the average		
2	growth in bills for residential customers; and		
3	WHEREAS, to be eligible for ELIA and EAP, total household income of all household member		
4	may not exceed 70 percent of the Washington State median income for the number of		
5	individuals living in the household; and		
6	WHEREAS, SCL and SPU's June 2019 response to Statement of Legislative Intent 40-1-B-1		
7	contains recommendations to expand access to emergency assistance by increasing		
8	income eligibility to 80 percent of state median income and to allow application of		
9	emergency assistance toward 100 percent of a customer's delinquent bills; and		
10	WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to expand access to emergency assistance for low-income		
11	customers and align the SCL and SPU programs; NOW, THEREFORE,		
12	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:		
13	Section 1. Section 21.49.042 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance		
14	124836, is amended as follows:		
15	21.49.042 Emergency low-income assistance program		
16	A. An emergency credit of $((50))$ <u>100</u> percent of a customer's delinquent bills up to a		
17	maximum credit ((of \$200)) as provided in subsection 21.49.042.C may be granted by the		
18	Department to income_eligible residential accounts, metered for a single household, ((which))		
19	that qualify under the following criteria:		
20	1. Total household income does not exceed ((70)) <u>80</u> percent of <u>the</u>		
21	Washington State ((Median Income)) median income; and		
22	2. Have completed an Emergency Low-Income Assistance program		
23	application where income eligibility is verified; and		

condition of receiving emergency assistance under this program.

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Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
