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## **1. BILL SUMMARY**

**Legislation Title:** A RESOLUTION stating the City Council's intent to consider legislation in 2020 that would expand Chapter 14.30 of the Seattle Municipal Code to require employers to provide employees with transit subsidies, and to consult with City of Seattle departments and relevant stakeholders in the development of such legislation and related policies.

**Summary and background of the Legislation:** In October 2018, the City Council (Council) unanimously passed, and the Mayor signed, the Commuter Benefits Ordinance, enacted by the City of Seattle (City) as Chapter 14.30 of the Seattle Municipal Code. Effective January 1, 2020, the Commuter Benefits Ordinance requires certain employers, with 20 or more employees worldwide, to offer employees the opportunity to use pre-tax earnings to purchase commuter benefits other than parking, such as transit and vanpool expenses.

While the Commuter Benefits Ordinance is an important first step in influencing commute choices, expanding the ordinance could better support the City's goals for the Seattle Climate Action Plan, the Green New Deal, the 2015 Move Seattle Plan, the Commute Trip Reduction program, the 2015 Move Seattle Plan, equitable access to transit, and other policies for addressing climate change and income inequality.

This resolution intends for the Council to consider legislation in 2020 that would expand the Commuter Benefits Ordinance to require employers to provide employees with transit subsidies, while taking into consideration the differing abilities of employers to absorb these costs based on their size. This resolution also states an intent for the Council to conduct a racial equity analysis to incorporate race and social justice principles; consult with the Office of Labor Standards and relevant stakeholders to develop the legislation; and consult with City Departments and non-profits to develop related policies.
