3 4 5 6 7	A RESOLUTION reaffirming The City of Seattle's support of unbanked money transfer operators and the immigrant communities they serve. WHEREAS, the City Council passed Resolution 31578 to help support money transfer operators
8	(MTOs); and
9	WHEREAS, though the Office of Immigrant and Refugee Affairs (OIRA), Office of Economic
10	Development (OED), and Finance and Administrative Services (FAS) have made efforts
11	to find a solution for unbanked MTOs, those efforts have not yet yielded a positive result;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, a recent string of armed robberies on these unbanked MTOs (that store large
14	amounts of cash in their premises) in Seattle and surrounding cities has turned this issue
15	into a public safety concern; and
16	WHEREAS, East African immigrant communities in Seattle rely on these MTOs to send money
17	to their loved ones abroad. For example, every year Somalia receives approximately \$1.3
18	billion in remittances and more than 730,000 people in Somalia are dependent on
19	financial assistance for survival. Funding from remittances accounts for basic needs
20	including food, water, shelter and education. One in every five children in Somalia dies
21	before their fifth birthday, and only 30 percent of the population has access to clean
22	drinking water; and
23	WHEREAS, over the past few years, these MTOs have found it increasingly difficult to operate
24	without a bank account. Many have shut down, and the ones that remain transport
25	millions of dollars in cash through SeaTac Airport each month; and

1	WHEREAS, these MTOs provide culturally specific services; deliver money to remote regions
2	not served by the large operators, including refugee camps in East Africa; provide good
3	paying jobs; contribute to community activities; and are a valuable members of Seattle's
4	small business community; and
5	WHEREAS, Seattle has one of the biggest East African communities in the United States –
6	nearly 30,000 Ethiopians, Eritreans, and Somalis are Seattle residents, and thousands
7	more are estimated to live in King County; and
8	WHEREAS, the vast majority of Seattle's East African residents are refugees and new residents
9	need effective systems that will support them in staying connected to their loved ones
10	back home; and
11	WHEREAS, East Africans are critical to Seattle's economic vitality because they purchase
12	goods and services and run small businesses, which in turn create jobs and generate
13	revenue for the region; and
14	WHEREAS, it is in The City of Seattle's interest to promote financial inclusion and public
15	safety; and
16	WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature and the State of Washington have jurisdiction
17	over State licensed banks; and
18	WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature and the State of Washington have the authority to
19	pass laws and develop processes that promote financial inclusion and public safety;
20	NOW, THEREFORE,
21	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:
22	Section 1. The City of Seattle reaffirms its support of the East African community in their
23	desire to support their loved ones in the Horn of Africa. The City of Seattle also reaffirms the

Furthermore, 2 The City of Seattle strongly urges the Washington State Senate Financial Institutions, Economic 3 Development & Trade Committee and the House Consumer Protection and Business Committee 4 to study policy options for and explore legislation about bank de-risking and its impact on public 5 safety and equal access. 6 Section 2. The City Council requests that Office of Intergovernmental Relations staff 7 reach out to the State of Washington and the Washington Legislature to explore actions they can 8 take to promote financial inclusion for Seattle residents and businesses.
