AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 126000, which adopted the 2020 Budget; changing appropriations to the Legislative Department; appropriating funds from the Revenue Stabilization Fund; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts; all by a 3/4 vote of the City Council.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Appropriations for the following items in the 2020 Budget are adjusted as follows:

Section 2. The Council intends that the appropriation described in Section 1 of this ordinance will be used to enter into contracts with community-based organizations to research processes that will promote public safety informed by community needs. Deliverables could include:

- A. Staffing, training, administrative and technical support, and materials to begin process;
- B. Preliminary work plan and initial needs assessment, including language access needs;
- C. Community participatory budget process, data collection, and analysis;
- D. Data reporting and presentations; and
- E. Develop and share roadmap for future equitable participatory budget processes related to public safety.
