

Tennis Center Sand Point Background

- Tennis Center Sand Point (TCSP) is a public indoor facility that offers a broad array of group tennis programs for people all ages, backgrounds, and skill levels.
- The mission is to create the best customer experience, cultivate community, and educate players to succeed on and off the court.
- Operating since 2013, TCSP has consistently offered subsidized court times and programs that exceed the contract requirements.
- TCSP strives to offer a balanced program mix to best meet the community's growing tennis-related needs.



Concession Agreement Background

- In 2010, SPR and TCSP executed a 20-year Amended and Restated Concession Agreement. The agreement involved building, operating, and managing a tennis facility at Magnuson Park.
- Building 41 (former gas station) was included in the agreement. Renovation of this structure proved unfeasible for TSCP. The proposed amendment returns this building to SPR management.
- The public benefit requirements and language are clarified to meet current standards.



Concession Agreement Amendment

- Building 41 management transfer: Building 41 returns to SPR management. There is interest in it becoming a visitors' center.
- Public benefit exhibit updated: Public benefit exhibit strengthened and clarified to match current standards. Requirements and offset amount clearly identified. (See next slide.)
- Additional 5-year term extension option
- Miscellaneous administrative changes



Public Benefits

Examples of public benefits eligible for offsetting the annual base concession fee:

Public Access

- Free court time for youth and seniors
- Public restrooms for Magnuson Park field users

Scholarships

 Scholarships for low-income youth, adults and families, especially those living in housing within the park boundaries

Programs

 Low-cost or free tennis programs for YMCA, youth with disabilities and other special needs

Note: many of the public benefits prioritize low-income residents at Magnuson Park
