


## SKAGIT WILDLIFE HABITAT MITIGATION PROGRAM

- 1995 Skagit Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) License and 1991 Wildlife Settlement Agreement requires expenditure of \$17 million (1990\$) on wildlife habitat acquisition and management through 2025
- SCL has expended approximately \$16.9 million to date
- Over 10,400 acres purchased, protected, and managed for wildlife

## GLACIER VIEW RANCH DEED ACCEPTANCE **ORDINANCE**

- After 2+ years of negotiation, SCL successfully purchased three Skagit County parcels totaling 140 acres in 2019
- Funded by \$502,580 from Skagit mitigation budget
- Accepting the deed demonstrates The City of Seattle's commitment, through meeting requirements under the FERC license to operate the Skagit River Hydroelectric Project, to preserve fish and wildlife habitat



## GLACIER VIEW RANCH CHARACTERISTICS

- Includes 1,000 ft of salmon-bearing Corkindale Creek
- Composed of forest, riparian, and pasture
- Adjacent to state and federal land improving habitat connectivity
- Adjoins SCL transmission line rightof-way
