11	global pandemic, which is particularly severe in high risk populations such as people with
12	underlying medical conditions and the elderly, and the WHO has raised the health
13	emergency to the highest level requiring dramatic interventions to disrupt the spread of
14	this disease; and
15	WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, Governor Jay Inslee declared a statewide state of emergency
16	in response to outbreaks of the COVID-19 disease in Washington; and
17	WHEREAS, in response to outbreaks of the COVID-19 disease in Seattle, Mayor Jenny Durkan
18	proclaimed a civil emergency exists in the City of Seattle in the Mayoral Proclamation of
19	Civil Emergency dated March 3, 2020, modified by the City Council through Resolution
20	31937; and
21	WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, the Governor issued a "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order,
22	which, combined with other measures taken to prevent the transmission of COVID-19,
23	effectively closed many businesses in the state of Washington; and
24	WHEREAS, many people in Seattle continue to struggle with the impacts of the COVID-19
25	public health emergency and the measures taken to prevent its spread, including
26	unemployment, housing insecurity, food insecurity; and

1	WHEREAS, local companies have reported laying off employees, experiencing substantial
2	revenue losses, dealing with lost business due to fear and stigma, and seeing major declines
3	in foot traffic as tens of thousands of employees are being asked to work from home; and
4	WHEREAS, these impacts are being felt across all industry sectors, including retail, restaurant,
5	hospitality, transportation, logistics, arts, and culture; and
6	WHEREAS, many of the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting economic downturn
7	are being felt disproportionately by our communities of color; and
8	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic requires additional efforts to protect and address the
9	needs of people experiencing homelessness, including expanding and de-intensifying
10	emergency shelter, increasing access to hygiene services and increasing the provision of
11	meals; and
12	WHEREAS, a number of City departments have implemented immediate assistance for affected
13	local small businesses and displaced workers; and
14	WHEREAS, the federal CARES Act was adopted on March 27, 2020 and contained
15	approximately \$131.5 million of Coronavirus Relief Fund that was distributed directly to
16	the City to respond to the public health emergency, and responses to the secondary effects
17	of the emergency such as expanded shelter, food procurement and distributions, and
18	economic support to those suffering from employment or business interruptions; and
19	WHEREAS, the City appropriated those Coronavirus Relief Fund funds in 2020, although not all
20	of those funds were spent, making them available to support continued relief in 2021; and
21	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council wish to reappropriate these funds in 2021 to continue
22	to support the people of Seattle during the ongoing COVID-19 public health emergency
23	and resulting economic downturn; NOW, THEREFORE,
