Section 1. Payment of the sum of \$18,491,585.57 on PeopleSoft 9.2 mechanical warrants numbered

4100389221- 4100391473 plus manual or cancellation issues for claims, E-Payables of \$73,564.09 on

PeopleSoft 9.2 9100007681- 9100007745 and Electronic Financial Transactions (EFT) in the amount of

ORDINANCE

COUNCIL BILL _____

AN ORDINANCE relating to land use and zoning; extending for six months a moratorium established by Ordinance 125764, and extended by Ordinances 126006 and 126090, on the filing, acceptance, processing, and/or approval of any application to establish a new principal or accessory use, or change a principal or accessory use, for any site currently used as a mobile home park, as defined in Section 23.84A.032 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council makes the following legislative findings of fact and declarations:

A. The Council incorporates by reference the findings of fact contained in Ordinance 125764.

B. In January 2019, the City Council passed Ordinance 125764, establishing a moratorium on the filing,

acceptance, processing, and/or approval of any application to establish a new principal or accessory use, or

change a principal or accessory use, for any site currently used as a mobile home park, as defined in Section

23.84A.032 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

C. In December 2019, that moratorium was extended for six months by Ordinance 126006.

D. In June 2020, that moratorium was again extended for six months by Ordinance 126090.

D. Although the City has worked to develop permanent regulations, the work has not been completed

and the City Council will not be able to consider and act on permanent regulations until after the expiration of the moratorium on January 8, 2021.

E. Work on permanent regulations has been limited due to the February 29 and March 3 proclamations of civil emergency by Governor Inslee and Mayor Durkan, respectively, related to the spread of COVID-19.

F. Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.390 authorizes the City to extend the duration of a

moratorium by ordinance for one or more six-month periods.

Section 2. The moratorium first set forth in Ordinance 125764, and extended by Ordinance 126006 and Ordinance 126090, shall be extended and in effect for a period of six months from the date the ordinance introduced as Council Bill 119907 is effective, and shall automatically expire after the six-month period unless the same is extended as provided by statute, or unless terminated sooner by the City Council.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to land use and zoning; extending for six months a moratorium established by Ordinance 125764, and extended by Ordinances 126006 and 126090, on the filing, acceptance, processing, and/or approval of any application to establish a new principal or accessory use, or change a principal or accessory use, for any site currently used as a mobile home park, as defined in Section 23.84A.032 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

The legislation would extend a moratorium established by Ordinance 125764. That moratorium was previously extended by Ordinances 126006 and 126090. The extended moratorium will expire on January 8, 2021.

Ordinance 125764 established a moratorium on the filing, acceptance, processing, and/or approval of any application to establish a new principal or accessory use, or change a principal or accessory use, for any site currently used as a mobile home park. The ordinance also established a work program for the Office of Planning and Community Development (OPCD) and the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections (SDCI) to develop proposed regulations for Council consideration and conduct any required environmental review pursuant to the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA). Those regulations could include land use regulations that protect residents of mobile home parks who suffer from housing insecurity.

The work program requested that the executive publish any required SEPA threshold determination by June 2019 and transmit proposed legislation to Council by September 2019. Although OPCD and SDCI have been working on a proposal the executive has not issued a SEPA threshold determination nor transmitted proposed legislation to the Council. The COVID-19 civil emergencies declared by the Governor and Mayor have forestalled the City's efforts to develop a proposal for Council consideration. A six-month extension of the moratorium is necessary to preserve the option for Council to consider future land use regulations related to mobile home parks.

There are currently at least two mobile home parks located in Seattle: (1) the Halcyon mobile home park located at 12234 Stone Av. N. and (2) the Bella B mobile home park located at 1301 N 125th St. Mobile homes are a source of market rate affordable housing. The Halcyon

mobile home park includes 76 homes, many of which are occupied by lower-income and elderly residents.

Existing mobile home parks house many low-income and senior households. Displacement of low-income residents could increase demand for services provided by affordable housing and human services providers.

The legislation affects property currently in use as mobile home parks. Those properties include, at least, the Halcyon mobile home park, located at 12234 Stone Av. N. and the Bella B mobile home park located at 1301 N. 125th St.

f. Please describe any perceived implication for the principles of the Race and Social Justice Initiative. Does this legislation impact vulnerable or historically disadvantaged communities? What is the Language Access plan for any communications to the public?

Mobile home parks offer market rate affordable housing to seniors and low-income households. This legislation extends a moratorium to allow the City to explore options for stabilizing those communities.
