COUNCIL BILL _____

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2018, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, Seattle Department of Transportation, Seattle Fire Department, Seattle Police Department, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants, private funding, and subsidized loans and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or the Mayor’s designee, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Fire Chief, the Chief of Police, and the Seattle Public Utilities General Manager and Chief Executive Officer are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below; and to execute, deliver, and perform, on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving funds identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as Council Bill 119272.

This program originated in the Human Services Department but was transferred to OIRA beginning in 2016. The current state contract runs until June 30, 2018.	\$370,000	General Fund (00100)
1.12	Executive - Office of Immigrant and Refugee Affairs (OIRA)	Seattle Housing Authority (SHA)	This grant supports the New Citizen Program, which contracts for needs-based naturalization assistance. This program originated in the Human Services Department but was transferred to OIRA beginning in 2016. The SHA contract runs until December 31, 2018. This funding requires a match of \$700,000 in non-federal funds, which will be provided by a combination of DSHS funds authorized in this ordinance and General Funds to OIRA in the New Citizen Program project.	\$25,941	General Fund (00100)
1.13	Seattle Public Utilities (SPU)	King County Flood Control District	This grant reimburses SPU for options analysis, design, permitting, and construction costs incurred from 2018 through 2020 for the Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI) for Protection of Beneficial Uses project (MC-SU-C3316), supporting improvements near Thornton Creek.	\$2,936,580	Drainage and Wastewater Fund (44010)

Section 2. The Director of Transportation is authorized to accept a subsidized loan from federal/state agencies.

Item	Department	Grantor	Purpose	Amount	Fund
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2.1	Seattle Department of Transportation	Washington State Public Works Board	This item accepts a subsidized loan from the Public Works Trust Fund (PWTF). The resources will be used to replace two parallel bridge structures that are seismically vulnerable. The two bridges will be replaced with a single bridge approximately 500 feet long and 65 feet wide. The bridge will accommodate a protected bike lane, pedestrian walkways, and three vehicle travel lanes. The PWTF Loan program is a low-cost lending option. The rate for this loan is 1.66%.	\$10,000,000	Transportation Fund (13000)

Section 3. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken after its passage and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
