COUNCIL BILL _____

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2018, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Executive Department, Department of Parks and Recreation, Human Services Department, Seattle Information Technology Department, Seattle Fire Department, and Seattle Police Department to accept specified grants, private funding, and subsidized loans and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor or the Mayor’s designee, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Director of the Human Services Department, the Chief Technology Officer, the Fire Chief, and the Chief of Police are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below; and to execute, deliver, and perform, on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving funds identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as Council Bill 119339.

The grant adds funding to project PRR0904 CLC Aki Kurose MS (\$77,175), project PRV0701 Camp Long (\$5,450), and project PRR0905-CLC-Denny MS (\$87,000) and will be used to ensure that youth have access to high quality Out of School Time programming.	\$169,625	Park and Recreation Fund (10200)

1.13	Seattle Fire Department (SFD)	US Department of Transportation through the Washington State Military Department	This grant from the US Department of Transportation through the Emergency Management Division of the State Military Department provides funding that will allow SFD to update its Hazardous Materials Response Plan and add appendices specific to Marine, Highway and Pipeline incidents. There is a 20% match of \$2,000 required for the grant and the period of performance is 5/1/18 through 12/31/18.	\$8,000	General Fund (00100)
